'Fungal Foraging for Beginners' by Biodiversity Club & PG Department of Botany

In an effort to understand the fungal diversity within the campus a systematic survey 'Fungal Foraging for Beginners' conducted by Biodiversity Club in association with PG Department of Botany, on o8 July 2024. The event coordinated by Deepa P., Surva E.V. and Ayisha Febin P.N. of PG Department of Botany. The primary objective of the event was to engage students in hands-on research and deepen their understanding of Mycology. The programme commenced with an introductory workshop on fungal identification techniques, led by Deepa P., Assistant Professor Adhoc, PG Department of Botany. Over the course of the programme, participants conducted regular field expeditions to collect fungal specimens. They meticulously documented the location, habitat and physical characteristics of each specimen using photography and detailed notes. Forty-one species were carefully handled and stored at Department of Botany to ensure the preservation for further study and analysis. In conclusion, the fungal hunting programme proved to be a successful initiative in fostering hands-on learning and research among students. Moving forward, the insights gained from this programme will serve as a foundation for future studies and conservation efforts related to fungi and their ecosystems.



Workshop on Microgreen Metamorphosis: The Art and Science of Microgreens

On 26 July 2024, the Department of Botany, KAHM Unity Women's College, organized an informative and practical workshop on 'Microgreen metamorphosis: the art and science of microgreens', aimed to enhance the students' knowledge and hands-on experience with cultivating microgreens, a trending topic in sustainable agriculture and nutrition. The first session of the event provided valuable insights into the cultivation and benefits of microgreens. Deepa P., Assistant Professor (Adhoc), PG Department of Botany, effectively covered essential topics, equipping participants with the knowledge needed to grow, manage and utilize microgreens efficiently. The session underscored the importance of microgreens in modern agriculture and nutrition, highlighting their potential to contribute to healthier diets and sustainable farming practices. During the hands-on session, students sowed microgreen seeds and monitored their growth for one week. After a period of growth, the microgreens were ready for harvest. Students actively participated in the harvesting process, learning the proper techniques to ensure maximum yield and quality. Once harvested, the microgreens packaged by the students and distributed to various college staff members including administrative and support staff. The workshop coordinated by Deepa P. and Sana V. from the PG Department of Botany, was a notable success which provided students with practical skills and knowledge on microgreen cultivation, and highlighted the importance of sustainable agricultural practices within the college community.



International Hansatech Research Award handover ceremony:

Dr. Faseela P, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, KAHM Unity Women's College, Manieri, ceremoniously handed over the prestigious International Hansatech Research Award i.e., a Pocket PEA instrument, Photosynthetic Efficiency Analyzer, rapid screening continuous excitation ultraportable chlorophyll fluorescence measurement system from Hansatech Instruments, King's Lynn, UK to Prof. Dr. Muhammed Basheer Ummathur, Principal of the college. This instrument was received as an International Award for obtaining the highest number of citations in WOS among the articles of the Special Issue in the International Journal Photosynthetica, Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic, entitled, 'Chlorophyll a fluorescence parameters as indicators of particular abiotic stress in rice'. This award, valued at 1.5 lakhs, marks a significant achievement in the study of photosynthesis and plant science. The handover ceremony was attended by Dr. Usman A, Head of the Department of Botany, along with other faculty members and enthusiastic students from the Botany Department. The Chlorophyll Fluorometer is an advanced instrument crucial for assessing photosynthetic efficiency and other fluorescence parameters in living plants, thereby enhancing research capabilities in botanical sciences at KAHM Unity Women's College. This award not only recognizes academic achievement but also reinforces KAHM Unity Women's College's position as a hub for innovative botanical research and education in the region, inspiring future generations of botanists and



researchers to explore new frontiers in plant biology. Inter Departmental Alumni Talk, 2024-2025: Leafy Vegetables for Karkidakam




Awareness session on 'Reproductive Health for Young Women' NSS171 & 008 units of KAHM Unity Women's College, Manjeri,


Kargil Vijay Diwas – Rajat Jayanti Mahostav
